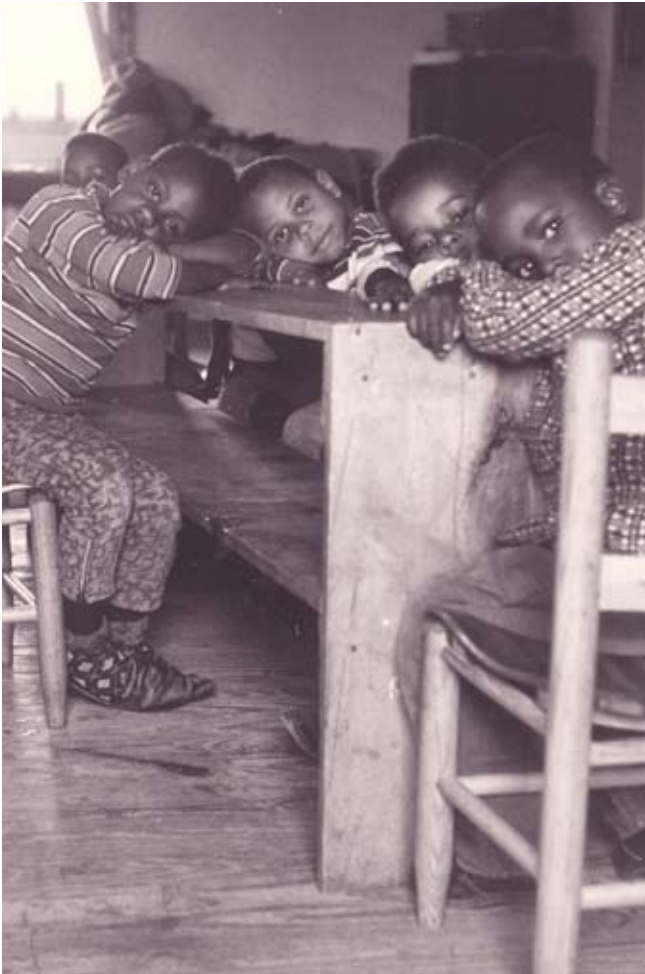


Sue Sojourner Exhibit, Reading, and Pizza Party

Sue [Lorenzi] Sojourner, a veteran of the Civil Rights Movement, worked in Holmes County, Mississippi from 1964 -1969. She is now writing a memoir entitled, “FREEDOM: Blacks Transforming Themselves — Growing a Grassroots Movement in 1960s Mississippi as Seen by One (Transformed) White Middle-Class Outside Agitator.” It tells of the real dangers and fears that the local leaders experienced and how they built one of the most effective grassroots Movements in the state.
